

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE SCHEDULE OF FEES AND CHARGES FOR THE  
FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF STATESBORO, GEORGIA

THAT WHEREAS, the City of Statesboro operates a Fire Department, which among other things is responsible for preparing reports on each fire incident it responds to; issuing permits allowing burning if conditions are right; and allowing water to be obtained from city fire hydrants by request; and

WHEREAS, in order to finance some of these operations, the City has previously and must continue to impose various fees and charges; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager, Finance Director, and the Fire Chief have recommended a schedule of fees and charges, and the Mayor and City Council upon careful review wish to implement said schedule of fees and charges;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Statesboro, Georgia this 3rd day of October, 2002 as follows:

Section 1. That the document entitled "Schedule of Fees and Charges for the Fire Department of the City of Statesboro, Georgia", attached hereto and incorporated into this Resolution by reference, is hereby adopted and approved as the fees and charges authorized to be charged by the department.

Section 2. That any provision of any ordinance or resolution, or administrative policy in conflict with this schedule is hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict; and the provisions of this Resolution shall take precedence in determining the fees and charges to which they apply.

Section 3. That this Resolution shall be and remain effective from and after its date of adoption.

Schedule of Fees and Charges for the Fire Department  
of the City of Statesboro, Georgia  
October 3, 2002

Water Distribution from the hydrant located at the Grady Street Fire Station is charged at \$2.50 per 1,000 gallons or any portion thereof, with a \$2.50 minimum charge.

Fire Incident Reports requested by insurance agents are charged at \$2.00 per report.

Burn Permits are issued at no charge.

Burn permits are issued only if the burn site and materials have been inspected and approved by designated fire department personnel.
